# I found kittens! What should I do?

Are the kittens visibily injured or hurt?

Take the kittens to your local vet as soon as possible

Estimate the age of the kittens, based on the way they look



#### Under 4 weeks old

Newborn kittens have closed eyes, folded ears and unable to stand. In 10 days, their eyes open, their ears stand up, and they start to move, but they are wobbly. After week 3, they start playing and are more alert.



#### Over 4 weeks old

No longer wobbly when walking. Pouncing and playing with siblings. Eyes begin to change from blue/grey to their adult colour. Baby teeth are fully erupted.



#### Over 8 weeks old

The kittens are fully weaned.
They are more skilled and
adventurous. They are ready to
be desexed. Follow our guide

## Can you see their nest or hiding place?

Gently return the kittens to their nest.

Ensure the kittens are somewhere safe and warm, and watch from a distance.
